### Working with private coal companies (p. 1)

### World Health Organisation (p. 3)

The main point of this paper is to counter damaging research on linking coal to premature deaths (in particular the WHO's figure that 3.7 million people die per year from fossil fuel pollution).

A 2012 study by the World Health Organisation found that ambient (outdoor air pollution) in both cities and rural areas was estimated to cause 3.7 million premature deaths worldwide per year.
